Project Name	Work Routes
Project Description	Focussing on those who are most disadvantaged and furthest from the labour market, this project provides tailored support to address worklessness. Flexible personalised packages of support enhance engagement and work readiness, and in work support helps ensure employment can be sustained. Their Health & Wellbeing advisers can support with lifestyle advice and health condition management tips. Once an individual enters employment Work Routes can continue to support for a further 26 weeks. Reed can help with paying for e.g. travel & childcare. If an employment outcome is assured e.g. Van license or PPE required for work, then the barrier can be, within reason, overcome.

Who is Eligible	Any individual over the age of 16 who has been either unemployed* or inactive** for 6 months or more. If an individual does not meet this eligibility criteria, then an individual would need to meet one criterion from the following list of "Barriers to Employment" to be eligible for Work Routes: - <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A member of a minority ethnic group, • an ex-offender, • a history of drug or alcohol misuse, • caring responsibilities, • a health condition, • a language barrier, • aged 50+, • homelessness, • lone parenthood, • a lack of formal qualifications, • a learning disability or other condition such as Autism or Asperger's, • a mental health condition or a physical disability (including sensory impairments such as deafness).

Project Description	<p>Who Dares Works in West Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly brings together a partnership Cornwall based social enterprises and organisations to help people who need the most support to connect or reconnect with work, education and training. The partnership builds on the unique strengths of each organisation working collaboratively to help participants to help themselves – wherever possible through helping others. The partnership prides itself on its collaborative working which includes 1-2-1 mentoring, specialist support, work related activity, work ready clubs and community clubs. At the heart of the project is the Active Plus course. Delivered by military veterans from Active Plus, the course has been designed to build confidence, motivation and self-belief to enable participants to move forward. Alongside attending the course, participants will work with their mentor to determine their long-term goal(s) and achieve them by tapping in to a range of specialist support and a host of work-related activities, from volunteering to community projects, taster days to work experience and everything in between.</p> <p>All of the above focuses on the two broader priority themes of participation in work and skills for the potential workforce.</p>

Project Description	<p>This project aims to help people take gentle steps back into work or training, while building friendships and connections with people in their community. Based at Newquay Community Orchard, the project offers hands on experience in gardening and outdoor cooking, construction, crafts, conservation and more. Covid-19 - The participants are being supported on a 1:1 basis, doing skill shares. They are learning exercises pottery planting pruning etc.</p> <p>We're keeping our community fed by providing free veggie boxes made up of freshly picked veggies from our Community Grow Space. We are also providing compost and seed kits with crib sheets and links to how-to videos to help people cook and grow in their homes. These can be collected from the Orchard (at a safe distance) every week. If you think that someone could benefit from a box and/or grow kit, please see the referral link below.</p> <p>We also have a small pot of crisis funding to distribute to people in crisis which is distributed on a referral basis. Please get in touch if you wish to refer someone and we will contact you to discuss.</p>

Project Description	<p>The Healthy Habits Academy (HHA) is an exciting programme of 1:1 coaching, helping people to identify and work through difficulties in their lives to achieve a good sense of overall wellbeing and help people back into work or education. The Healthy Habits Academy is already set up to work remotely with individuals and can provide coaching via video calls, phone calls, texts or emails (depending on what works best for the individual). We have found that during this uncertain time the HHA is providing participants with a sense of consistency and community as it is regular contact with someone they can talk things through with. There is also an eLearning element to the programme and participants will receive a login to complete the online aspect, which they will receive certificates to prove their achievement.</p> <p>The HHA was limited to a small post code area, however in light of the recent situation CLLD have now expanded this for us and we are able to work with any individual between the age of 16-65 who is not in education or training and can evidence their right to live and work in the UK, within the area of Camborne/Pool/Illogan and Redruth</p>
